



What's been happening with Rehabilitating Roe 8

12 March 2017

Labor Government scraps Roe 8 Highway extension as first act after election.

Celebration on announcement to halt works. Acknowledgment to all volunteers and community members who worked tirelessly to save the corridor, including

- Save Beelihar Wetlands
- Rethink the Link
- Cockburn Community Wildlife Corridor
- Noongar Traditional Owners
- and many more.

30 March

Proposal to clean-up and rehabilitate the Roe 8 site.

May - August

Rehabilitating Roe 8 Working group agree on immediate actions to be taken in regards to:

- appointing weed control contractor
- asbestos removal contractor
- removing mulch piles
- removal of construction fencing and barricades
- form a fencing sub-committee with key stakeholders to inform fencing strategy to protect rehabilitation areas.
- Removal of limestone tracks from inappropriate areas
- SERCUL appointed as monitors
- Scope for Rehabilitation Management Plan to be prepared and a rehabilitation sub-committee to be formed.
- Communications strategy and logo developed for Rehabilitating Roe 8 project.

11 August

Rehabilitating Roe 8 Rehabilitation Steering Committee appoints consultant to prepare 10 year Rehabilitation Management Plan

September - December

Emerge undertake community consultation in development of the Rehabilitating Roe 8 Management Plan development.

September

Murdoch University commence vegetation monitoring

October

Weed control works undertaken

- Bio-monitoring International appointed to conduct invertebrate sampling
- Murdoch University undertake vegetation monitoring

- Seed collection works commenced within corridor
- Species lists and nurseries approached to supply native seedlings for winter 2019
- Cockburn Community Wildlife Corridor host fortnightly weeding events (on-going)
- Weed mapping through corridor
